DITTANY

(*Cunila origanoides*)



Description:

Perennial, grows to 18 in. The square stems bear opposite, gray-green leaves that smell sweetly of oregano. Flowers tiny pink-purple. Blooms from late summer to autumn.

Culture: Grow in average, dry to medium moisture, well-drained soil in full sun to part shade.

Easily grown from seed. In the wild it grows in dry, open, rocky woods.

Ecology: This species is now extinct in New York City.
